

Canadian Roses

We had some very talented people breeding roses in Canada. Here are just a few, chosen for their lovely flowers and resistance to disease. All are repeat flowering.

'Cape Diamond' Pink shrub bred by Christian Bédard.

'Emily Carr' Medium red shrub. Part of the 'Artist Series' of roses.

'Henry Hudson' White shrub Part of the 'Explorer' rose series.

'Hope For Humanity' Red, shrub

'John Davis' Pink shrub of the 'Explorer' rose series. May be grown as a small climbing rose.

'Kathy Wade' Pink blend floribunda. Bred by Larry Lougheed.

Morden Blush Pink shrub maturing to 3' - 4' in height.

Morden Sunrise Yellow blend shrub maturing to 3' - 4' in height. In some areas it is susceptible to black spot and Japanese Beetles love this beautiful rose.

ACTTM Navy Lady - dark red shrub

The ACTTM Navy Lady rose has been named as a dedication to the thousands of Canadian women who served in the Women's Royal Canadian Naval Service, known as Wrens, and the women who continue to serve today as members of the Canadian Navy. Bred by Agriculture Canada.

'Prairy Joy' - pink, shrub

'Roberta Bondar' – repeat flowering yellow climbing rose. Bred by Joyce Fleming of Ontario.

'Thérèse Bugnet' – pink, hybrid rugosa which suckers freely. Bred by George Bugnet of Alberta. Nearly thornless stem hold medium pink, lightly scented flowers. Popular around the world.
