Other Canadian Bred Roses

Our country had and continues to have talented rose hybridizers. Here are a few other Canadian bred roses that our members have enjoyed growing. (Please note the availability of these roses across the country can vary.)

AC Navy Lady

AC Navy Lady is a red to dark red rose with strong disease resistance. It grows 50 to 65 cm high and up to 100cm wide. It is hardy to zone 4b.

Bred by Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada, this rose was named in dedication to the Canadian women who served in the Women's Royal Canadian Naval Service, and the women who continue to serve today as members of the Canadian Navy.



Butterball

Butterball is a light yellow once-blooming Shrub rose bred by Dr. Frank Leith Skinner. Its height is 185 cm and it is hardy to zone 2b.



Canada Blooms

Canada Blooms is a pink blend rose bred by Claude Richer. It grows to a height of 70 to 90 cm and is hardy with good disease resistance.



Hazeldean

Hazeldean is a medium yellow once blooming hybrid spinosissima bred by Percy H. Wright. It is hardy to zone 2b.



Loretta Lynn (Loretta Lynn Van Lear)

Loretta Lynn (Lorette Lynn Van Lear) is an apricot blend floribunda bred by Brad Jalbert. It is 60 cm high and 60 cm wide.

This rose is dedicated to Ms Loretta Lynn in honour of her 50 years in the music business, and is named for her Grammy Award winning album, Van Lear Rose.



Never Alone

This deep red rose with a white centre was bred by Larry Dyck. It is hardy to zone 3b.

It was introduced through the partnership of the Canadian Nursery Landscape Association and the Canadian Football League Alumni in support of cancer patients (Never Alone Cancer Foundation).



Olds College (Olds College Centennial)

This apricot shrub rose was bred by Larry Dyck. Its height is 60 to 90 cm and it is very hardy.

It was named for the 100th anniversary of Olds College, Alberta.



Roberta Bondar

Roberta Bondar is a medium yellow large flowered climber that grows up to 250 cm and is hardy to zone 5b. This rose was named for Dr. Roberta Bondar, Canada's first female astronaut.



Thérèse Bugnet

This medium pink hybrid rugosa was bred by George Bugnet. It grows 150 to 185 cm high and 120 to 185 cm wide and is hardy to zone 3a.
