

Climbing Roses

Species Roses

Rosa Eglaneria: Single cherry pink fragrant flowers. Once blooming. Canes 4'-5' tall. Nice red hips.

Rosa Forrestiana: Single deep pink fragrant flowers. Once blooming. Can grow as a shrub with canes over 5'.

Canadian Explorer Roses.

These roses were bred in Canada, are winter hardy and have good disease resistance. They are all classified as shrubs, but can be grown as small climbing roses.

Alexander MacKenzie: Double red blend flowers produced in clusters. Fragrant.

John Cabot: Double deep pink blooms with healthy foliage.

John Davis: Semi-double pink flowers on a bush that will make a small climbing rose.

Quadra: Lovely full red blooms with light fragrance. Makes a low climbing rose at 5' - 6' tall.

William Baffin: Double pink flowers. Vigorous, healthy growth.

William Booth: Single cherry red flowers.

Other Climbing Roses.

Aloha: Very double, medium pink, fragrant flowers.

Altissimo: Single large red blooms in sprays.

Dortmund: Single red flowers in sprays.

Dublin Bay: Double blooms, medium red, fragrant, in clusters.

Golden Arctic: Deep yellow double flowers in clusters. Fragrant.

Kordes® Golden Gate TM Golden yellow, healthy growth.

Jasmina™ Lavender pink flowers.

Laguna™ Fragrant pink flowers.



Lavender Lassie™: Double mauve pink fragrant flowers.

New Dawn: Double soft, shell pink flowers.

The Polar Star: small single white blooms, thorny. Needs lots of space but is impressive when mature specimen in bloom.

Red Corsair

Roberta Bondar: Double yellow flowers. Healthy growth, Canadian bred.

Swan Lake: Hybrid tea like flowers. White, tinged pink.



Westerland: Large double apricot blend flowers. Fragrant.
