

Earth-Kind® Project



Earth-Kind® is a special designation given to a select group of roses by the Texas AgriLife Extension Service through the Earth-Kind® landscaping program. Each variety is field grown for an average of 8 years. The roses are only watered the first year to help them get established but are not given any additional fertilizer. These are all roses currently in the market place, but selected from these field trials. Not all these roses are winter hardy, so you will need to confirm hardiness for your area. Polyantha Roses originally derived from crosses between two East Asian species (*Rosa chinensis* and *R. multiflora*). They feature short plants - some compact, others spreading in habit - with tiny blooms (1" in diameter on average) carried in large sprays, in the typical rose colors of white, pink and red. Polyanthas are prolific bloomers: From spring to fall, Polyantha shrubs might be literally covered in flowers, creating a strong color impact in the landscape. Polyantha roses are low-maintenance, disease-resistant, and winter hardy. The following Polyantha Roses have the Earth-Kind® designation.

'Cecile Brunner'

Polyantha, light pink scented blooms.

'La Marne'

Polyantha, pink flowers grow in clusters

'Perle D'Or'

Polyantha. Yellow blend with pink. Scented blooms appear in clusters.

'The Fairy'

Polyantha. Light pink flowers in sprays. Blooms until frost.
